Notice of Hearing

A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 10.00am on Wednesday 5 November 2008, at Radisson SAS hotel, Dublin Airport, Co. Dublin, Ireland. The hearing is open to any member of the public or the media who wishes to attend.

The case that will be heard on this day concerns four allegations that a member is guilty of misconduct under bye-law 8(a)(i), in that he falsely declared that he had Professional Indemnity Insurance cover on his Practising renewal forms for both 2003 and 2004, contrary to the Fundamental Principle of Integrity; failed to supply the Association with all the information necessary to enable the Association to complete its monitoring process efficiently; and failed to co-operate with the investigating officer.

The case will be heard by a panel of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee.
