## **Notice of Hearing**

A hearing of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee will take place at 10.00 am on 11 November 2008, at the Competition Appeal Tribunal, Victoria House, Bloomsbury Place, London WC1A 2EB. The hearing is open to any member of the public or the media who wishes to attend.

Three cases will be heard on this day:

- CASE 1        Concerns two allegations that a student is liable to disciplinary action in that she was convicted of five charges of stealing property and one charge of attempting to steal property, and committed a breach in that she failed to inform ACCA of her conviction.
- CASE 2        Concerns an allegation that a member is liable to disciplinary action in that she failed to comply with an order of the Admissions and Licensing Committee.
- CASE 3        Concerns two allegations that a member is liable to disciplinary action in that he pleaded guilty at a magistrates court to 9 separate counts of false accounting, the court having also to take into consideration a further 100 such offences; and committed a breach by failing to inform ACCA of his conviction.

The cases will be heard by a panel of ACCA's Disciplinary Committee.
